Puppy to the Rescue  
by Miles Standish

I wonder how many VVCC members have heard of the Linux distribution by Barry Kauler called Puppy? I have been getting acquainted with it to some extent lately, and I'd like to share some thoughts and experience about it. For starters, here's a quote by Howard Fosdick in DesktopLinux.com:

"Puppy Linux is one of the twenty most popular Linuxes world-wide, according to the distro-tracking website Distrowatch. Puppy's distinct personality makes it of interest to those who want a Linux that...

Includes all the applications required for daily use  
Works right out of the box

Is easy to use, even for Linux newbies and Windows refugees  
Runs fast and performs well -- especially on limited hardware  
Runs on old computers, thin clients, and diskless workstations  
Installs and boots from any bootable device, including USB memory sticks, hard disks, Zip drives, LS 120/240 SuperDisks, CDs and DVDs, rewritable CDs and DVDs, and network interfaces.

"What is so fascinating to me about this is that Puppy runs like lightning in RAM; you don't even need a hard drive! Puppy is really lean - the whole operating system, with plenty of applications is contained in a download of 94.1MB. Applications include word processing, spreadsheet, a tool to quickly and easily configure Internet connections by dial-up or ethernet, a clone of Firefox web browser, a CD/DVD burner program, and far too many others to mention. Puppy has drivers for some Winmodems for dial-up Internet access. Puppy can access files on NTFS and FAT32 partitions, so it can be used to clean up problems in Windows. For example, booting from my USB memory stick, I have seen it use a free and updated version of f-prot anti-virus to clean out malware from a Windows XP machine. My son in Costa Rica made an important contribution to this distribution by providing programming that configures GPRS modems that are popular in other countries. I get some donated computers for "refurbishing" that are hardly worth a modern Windows system, but work very well with Puppy. If you would like to explore with Puppy, let's look at it together.

### **www.belarc.com**

I know that you have all the CD's that came with your computer, and programs you purchased since buying your computer, stored in a safe place. A place that you can quickly locate, <grin>. You should also know what version of Windows you are using and what Service Packs (SP2 or SP3) are installed. You can locate this information at any time by right-mouse clicking the "My Computer" icon and choosing "properties" from the resulting menu.

But there is a better way that I encourage every computer owner to use. If you have not already gotten the program "Belarc Advisor", go to the internet, [www.belarc.com](http://www.belarc.com) and download the free program called "Advisor". Install and run this program. It does not do anything 'for' or 'to' your computer except inventory it.

When your run Advisor, it produces a Web-like page that lists every piece of hardware in, or connected to, your computer and every software you have installed. The listing includes the brand name, serial numbers, version and Product Code used to install software. You then print this inventory and store it away with your CDs and manual. When asked any questions about what you have in the way of hardware, or software, including what windows updates were installed, you can bring out that sheet and answer the technician. (Great piece of insurance information if a fire or theft gets your computer.)

Since Advisor does not improve or hurt performance, you only run the program if you change a piece of hardware or add/remove software. But because Windows Updates are provided monthly, I run a new printed copy about every three months, just for the record.

COSTELLO: You recommended something ?  
ABBOTT: Yes.  
COSTELLO: For my office?  
ABBOTT: Yes.  
COSTELLO: OK, what did you recommend for my office?  
ABBOTT: Office.  
COSTELLO: Yes, for my office!  
ABBOTT: I recommend Office with Windows.  
COSTELLO: I already have an office with windows! OK, let's just say I'm

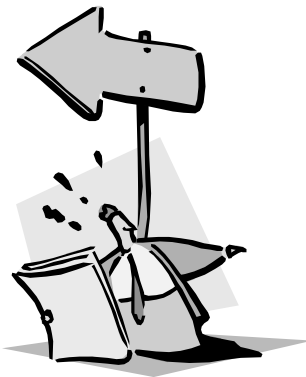
sitting at my computer and I want to type a proposal. What do I need?

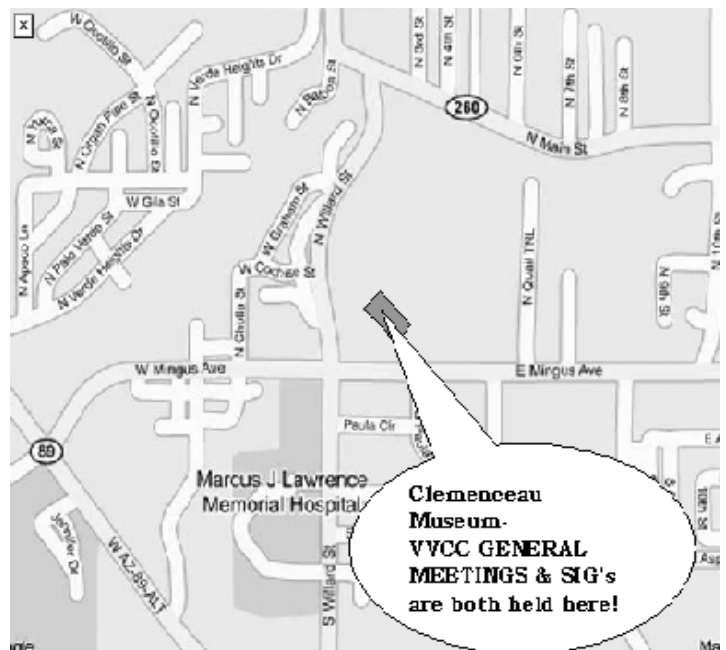
